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## Year 11 French and Art visit to Paris: October 2024

Allo allo, I shall say this only once. Year 11 students of French and Art have just returned from a 4 day trip to Paris. Here is how it went. Less than 10 minutes after leaving the ferry, we heard the phrase 'I can taste the baguettes already'. On Monday, we went to the Montmartre area of Paris, where we visited the Place du Tertre area and saw the Sacre-Coeur, after getting out steps in (literally!). Then, we circled around the Arc de Triomphe in the coach, too many times to count and had some free time on the Champs -Elysées, where you could see expensive designer shops and many cafés where you could get a strong coffee (Miss Wilson can confirm this!)



Next, we viewed modern art in the Pompidou Centre and got drenched in a rainstorm after we left, so very similar to the UK. On the way back to our accommodation, we experienced the joy of hearing Miss Wilson singing classic French songs over the microphone, along with a student who had purchased a harmonica.

On Tuesday, we started the day on a boat trip along the river Seine, past the Eiffel Tower and Notre Dame. We then visited the Musée d'Orsay, where we saw a lot of impressionist art pieces. We then had some free time in the Latin Quarter before visiting Montparnasse Tower, the tallest building in Paris, where there was a 360 view of the city.

Our trip to Paris was informative, a once in a lifetime opportunity and overall one massive laugh. This is a trip we will all never forget.

Thank you to Miss Wilson for organising this amazing trip and to Mrs Jennings, Mrs Le Grande, and Mr Downes who were great to see having fun with their students outside of the classroom.

## Year 11 Geography Students Explore Flood Risk at the Esk Valley

This week, Year 11 GCSE geography students from Lady Lumley's School ventured to the picturesque Murk Esk River in Goathland for a hands-on field trip aimed at investigating flood risk in the river's upper course. Armed with a variety of sampling techniques, the students engaged in practical data collection, examining factors that contribute to flooding in the area.

Despite facing challenging weather conditions, including rain and fog, the students embraced the experience with enthusiasm and determination. The trip provided an invaluable opportunity to apply theoretical concepts learned in the classroom to real-world scenarios, essential preparation for the upcoming GCSE Geography Paper 2 exam.

Throughout the day, students worked collaboratively, conducting river measurements, assessing land use, and analysing potential flood risks. They gained a deeper understanding of fluvial processes and the importance of environmental management.

Many students stood out as exceptional fieldworkers, including Elliot and Ruby who explicitly supported members of their group throughout the duration of the day.

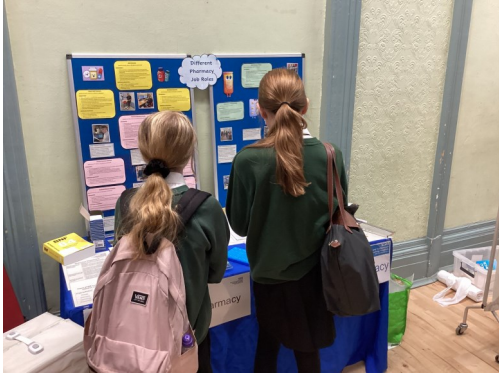
