As every year, Year 9 were fortunate that Stephen and Maria from An Invisible Man Theatre Group were able to come in and perform YOLO (You Only Live Once) followed by a workshop. The play and workshop explored what risk looks like, how we manage it and the potential consequences when we misjudge situations, particularly linked to alcohol or drug consumption. Year 9 were, as expected, a credit to the school and both Stephen and Maria passed on how impressed they were with our students' engagement with the play and workshop. Stephen and Maria will be back later in the school year to work with Years 7, 8 and 10. We're also looking forward to welcoming the NSPCC in January as part of their outreach programme using Theatre in Education to explore issues around coercive relationships.

# **Cycling Achievement**

On 27th October Ezra B competed in the Cycling Time Trials National Hill Climb Championships, which was held in Hexham, Northumberland. Riding for Clifton Cycling Club, Ezra was competing in the junior category, which includes riders up to the age of 18. Ezra achieved his goal of getting on the podium, finishing third in the junior category, and also winning his age group medal for fastest 14 year old rider with a time of 3mins 40.3s. He may be the first under 16 rider to get on the junior podium at the National Championship.
