INTRODUCTION

Dear Parents and Carers,

College is looking fully festive again, it is always joyous and excitable at this time of year. My thanks go to the students who had the most rewards in college, who got the reward of assisting with decorations, they have done a super job.

This week 192 (75%) of our students had perfect attendance, thank you, the next paragraph isn't for you!

I appreciate that as we reach the end of term students get tired, that also winter weather brings with it viruses and colds, but the attendance of 25% of students this week has been particularly disappointing.

Year 9 attendance was 90.3% - this equates to 163 hours of year 9 learning lost.

Year 10 attendance was 90.6% - this equates to 237 learning hours lost.

Year 11 attendance was 91.4% - equating to 159 learning hours lost.

This compares to a **national position of 94.1%.** If nationally students can reach this figure then so should our students. If attendance continues at this rate, nationally, cohorts of students will be getting better opportunities, learning and study time, and these all lead to better results, which in the long term effect life choices.

Please can I urge parents to ensure that their children are attending well, and at least above national positions. You can see your own child's attendance on Bromcom and if we can assist you in anyway please let us know.

On another note, please make a point of looking at the table at the end of the newsflash for key dates and events. **Term ends on Friday 20th December at 13:30pm** and opens again to pupils on **Tuesday 7th January at 08:45am**. Staff have been instructed to deliver purposeful lessons all the way through term – so please don't have the mindset of "it's the end of term, they'll just be playing games" as this is not the case.

North Yorkshire Council will be informed and will consider issuing **Penalty Notice Fines where** there have been 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

Please be aware that for those students whose attendance is being formally monitored in school, any absence due to illness must be supported by medical evidence before authorisation is possible, and it remains the responsibility of the parent to provide this evidence.

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
