Class OC & OS

This week we have continued to talk about different celebrations. We found out about Remembrance Day and made poppies using patterned scissors. We also learnt about the Hindu Festival of Light 'Diwali' and made Rangoli patterns.

In maths we introduced 4 and 5. We talked about different ways of representing the amount, looked for them in the classroom and began to think about one more and one less.

In phonics we learnt four new sounds; Y Z QU and CH.





Year 1



Who's are these footprints and where do they go? That was the question we have been wondering in our Talk 4 Writing sessions. We have been retelling the story of The Gruffalo's Child and writing some great time openers ready to write our warning stories.

In design technology we have been learning about wheels and axles. We first made axles with construction kits before making them with wood and cardboard.

In history we found out that the boat was the first mode of transport invented and looked at how they have changed. We also looked at the different uses for boats such as moving things, rescue, holidays and for fun.

A little reminder that we now have 2 PE lessons. Both classes have PE on Monday. Miss Scuffham's class has their second lesson on Tuesdays and Mrs Allenby's have theirs on a Wednesday. Please can we have PE kits in on these days.







Class 25 & 2MT

In PE, we have been practicing our chest passes with netballs and developing our dance skills.

The children have been architects and designers this week in Design Technology. They have made 3D shapes using nets and created mock-ups. They have tested different joining materials to see which are the strongest and most appealing.

In RE, we have been learning about Advent and why Christians celebrate Christmas.





Year 3

Class 3C & 3WR

In P.E., the children have been busy building their netball and dance skills. In netball we focused on mastering the chest pass and practiced moving the ball around the court without running with it.

In dance the children enjoyed moving their bodies to an upbeat, energetic song, experimenting with rhythm and creative movements.

This week in science, we have been learning all about the purpose of a skeleton. The children explored how our skeleton supports, protects, and allows us to move. They also had fun labelling and identifying the bones in a human skeleton—ask them if they can point out where the ribcage and skull are.

In Design & Technology, the children learned about the German architect, Mies Van Der Rohe, and his iconic designs. They showcased their creativity by crafting miniature mock-ups of the Barcelona Chair, using different materials and joining techniques.







Year 4

Class 45 & 4M

Year 4 have been so busy this week. Our highlight has to be our trip to the Buddhist centre. We learnt all about what Buddhists believe and shared our knowledge of what we have learnt in the classroom. We loved being in the shrine room and doing some mindful meditation thinking about the being kind and keeping 'our diamond inside shining'.

In maths, we have been multiplying 2 digit numbers by a one digit number. We emotionally came to the end of Edward Tulane this week and have reflected on the journey Edward has been on. What a changed rabbit! Our writing has also involved Edward Tulane this week as we continue to work towards writing a discussion text.

We started netball in PE this week and it was great to see the children have come to year 4 with some great skills and knowledge of netball and are keen to learn more.





Year 5

Class 5G & 5Bt

It has been another very busy week in Year 5.

In Maths, we have started our new unit on fractions and the children did really well finding equivalent fractions.

Our Geography work on mountains has continued, with the children learning about the 5 different types of mountain and how they are formed. Ask if they remember!

In PSHE we are learning to celebrate differences; the children's responses have made us very proud and demonstrate what a tolerant and supportive group they are.

In Writing, we are continuing to build up our sentence construction skills to support us in writing an exciting alien story.

Finally, it was fantastic to see the Year 5s participate so maturely and respectfully in our act of remembrance on Monday.


The children have finished writing their Lighthouse story and have done some fabulous editing on sentence types to include a variation to keep the reader interested.
