If your child is absent and we have not received a reason we will telephone on the first day of absence. We may also make a home visit.

For safeguarding reasons, we operate a 3-day visual policy during absences from Lady Lumley's School. After this timescale, a student must be visually seen by a member of Lady Lumley's School staff. Home visits may also be conducted on day 4 of absence, if contact has been made daily by a parent/ guardian. Home visits may be more frequent, at the discretion of the Head of the School and the safeguarding team. For safeguarding reasons, it may be necessary to request Police welfare home visits and / or social care support.

Lateness

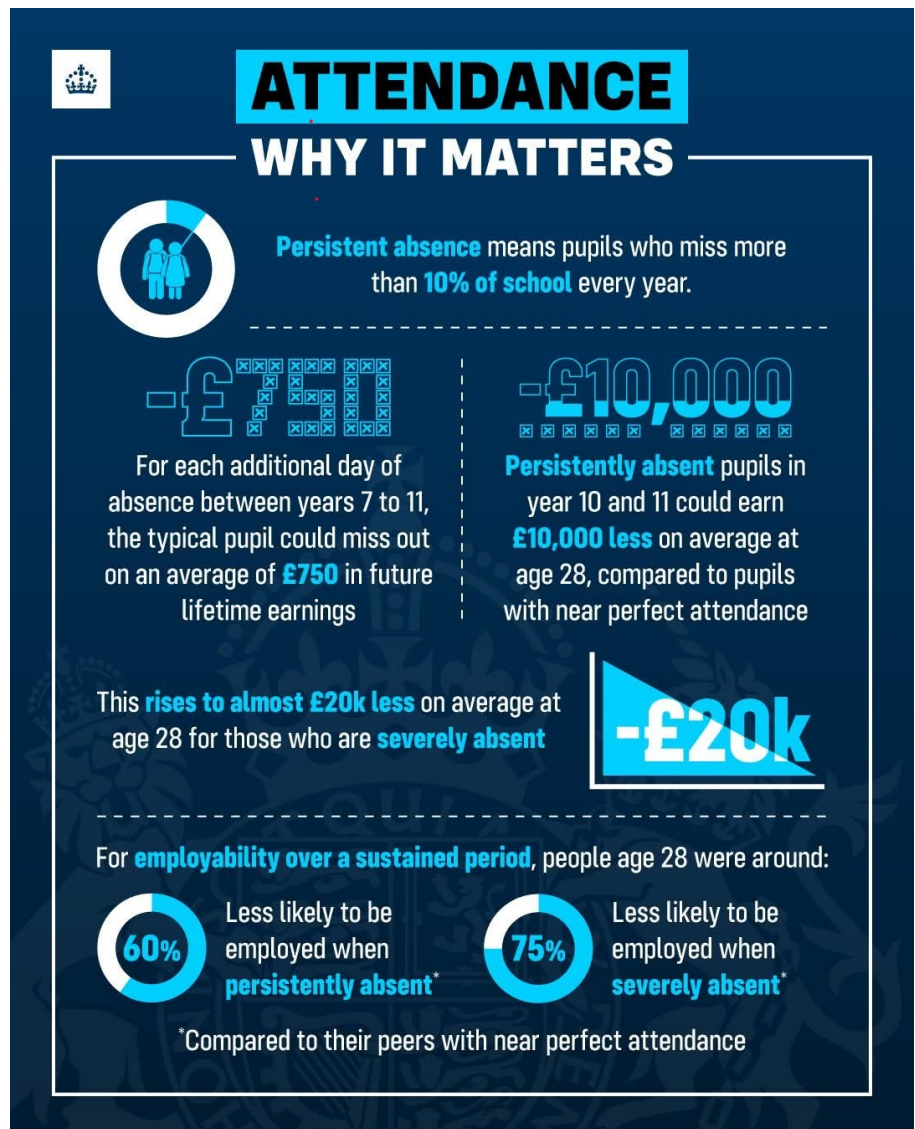
How we manage lateness:

The school day starts at 8.55am. We expect all students to be in by 8.50am, to be in class on time.

If a pupil arrives at the school after 8.55am they MUST sign in at the main reception where a behavioural consequence will be issued to the student.

At 9.10am the registers will be closed. In accordance with the regulations, if a student arrives after this time, they may receive a mark that shows them to be on site, but this will not count as a present mark and will mean they have an unauthorised absence, this code is a U.

UK Space design competition March 2025

On Friday 7th March Alex B and Billy H travelled to London with Dr Harron from Scalby and his 2 students for the UK Space Design Competition, with a potential trip to NASA.

The train was late, but we soon booked to our accommodation – the luxury YHA Ealing.

Saturday morning arrived and our little group of intrepid scientists walked to Imperial College, passing the glorious architecture of the Natural History Museum and a recreation of 'Dippy'. As we entered the college there was a buzz of anticipation. The group was registered and entered the auditorium, on the big screen there were 4 teams, and our group were allocated to Earhart. Our students would be working with Poole Grammar, Halcyon School, Reading School, Nottingham and Ealing School, The Judd School and Solar flared jeans. There were 269 students taking part, with a possible 12 places to go to NASA. We were given a short talk about the competition and an overview of the task the students had to complete – they had to design a settlement for mining in the asteroid belt in the year 2077.



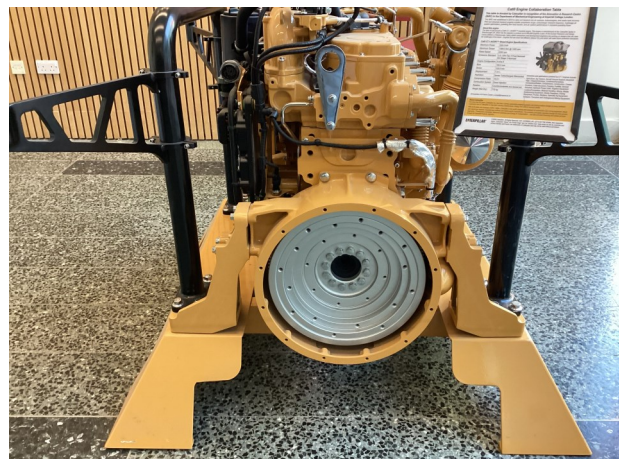
The 4 teams were allocated CEO's all who had been in winning teams before. Then they were taken to different areas in their teams to begin the challenge. They were issued a design brief which contained all the elements they had to include. Staff were then banished from the room. At 7pm the students were given pizza and the work continued before returning to the YHA at around 9pm – but the work did not stop – most if not all students worked well into the early hours with some not even going to bed! The presentation had to be submitted by 8am Sunday morning.

Some exhausted students walked to Imperial, after what seemed an age, we were back in the auditorium and the presentation began. Students were reminded that there could only be one winner. Earhart's presentation was energetic and engaging and was described as phenomenal by one of the judges.

Although Earhart did not win, Alex and Billy said it was 'an experience like no other' and it was like 'stepping into the future'. Both Alex and Billy thought the building was awe inspiring with a huge Rolls Royce engine in the entrance hall.

Alex and Billy when asked if they would recommend the competition 'highly recommended to have a go should the opportunity arrive' – so watch this SPACE !!!

Year 7 Students excel in Infiltration Fieldwork

As part of their geography topic, "Can water be managed?", Year 7 students recently undertook an exciting infiltration fieldwork project. This hands-on experience allowed them to explore how different surface types impact flood risk.

Armed with their tools and a keen sense of curiosity, the students independently conducted experiments on various surfaces, such as grass, concrete, and soil. They measured infiltration rates and observed how quickly water was absorbed or repelled by each surface. This practical approach not only enhanced their understanding of flood management but also prepared them for the many fieldwork experiences they will enjoy on their geography journey at Lady Lumley's School.

The students demonstrated remarkable independence and proficiency in applying fieldwork techniques, showcasing geography in the real world. Their results will form the basis of their fieldwork enquiry, which will be completed in subsequent lessons. This fieldwork experience has undoubtedly enriched their learning journey, making geography both engaging and relevant.

This version is a preview of the full performance. The opening night is the following week but visiting a preview will allow the audience an insight into the stages of a performance project.
