English Schools County X-Country Championships 2025

After qualifying in 4th place at the Schools County Championships Harriet was selected to represent North Yorkshire Schools at the National Year 7 Cross Country Final at Stoneleigh, Kenilworth.

In a National race it is always tricky on the start with so many runners. Harriet got a bad start and was to the back of the pack at the first corner, a lot of work needed to be done.

Harriet kept her composure and was able to make her way through the crowds of runners. With 500m to go Harriet was in 57th position and was hoping for a top 50 place. With a sprint finish she managed to finish 49th and was 3rd fastest from North Yorkshire.

As a team, North Yorkshire finished 5th overall.

Outdoor Education

Outdoor Education club – Mountain Biking

Mr Mann, Mr Martin, and Mrs Pye led an exciting outdoor education club mountain biking session at Dalby Forest, guiding an enthusiastic group of students through an unforgettable adventure. Tackling the challenging blue and red routes, the students excelled, showing determination and energy as they navigated each trail with skill and confidence.

Staff were incredibly impressed by the resilience and leadership shown by all students on this adventure. After half-term, students will be heading out on the water for some canoeing and kayaking.



DofE Gold

Year 13 students met this week with Mr Mann to finalise the plans for their prestigious Gold qualifying expedition. The students have planned an incredibly exciting, 4 day walking expedition, commencing in Buttermere, traversing the fells to Keswick and then onwards to Patterdale. DofE staff are looking forward to using the new Delta outdoor education centre in Patterdale as the base for this expedition. Once completed, the students will be able to complete their Gold award and await an invitation to one of the Royal Palaces for presentation.

DofE Bronze

Year 10 students are looking forward to their Bronze qualifying expedition, which runs from Thursday 17th until Friday 18th July. Students will be assessed by a DofE assessor against the 20 conditions of DofE. Their intensive training at Peat Rigg means that they are very skilled in all aspects of the expedition framework. Successful completion of the expedition allows students to complete their Bronze award and be presented with their award at a very special presentation evening in the Autumn term!

To prepare for this, students should now be uploading their DofE assessor's reports to EdofE. If they have met the requirements for Bronze, they may now begin their physical, skill and volunteering activities for Silver.

How to upload an assessor's report

To upload an assessor's report to EDofE, log in to your account at eDofE.org and navigate to the relevant section of your award (Volunteering, Physical, Skill, Expedition, or Residential). Click "Add Evidence" and select "Assessor's Report." You can upload a scanned copy of the report card, a photo of the report, or paste the text from an email sent by your assessor. Ensure the report includes the participant's start/end dates, goals, achievements, and assessor's details. Save and submit the report for approval by your DofE Leader. 


